Carpenter allegedly then taunted the victim with the stun gun by "arcing" it very close to the victim's face. While Carpenter and the victim didn't know each other, they were with friends who did know each other. Carpenter was charged with Grand Larceny 4th degree, Criminal Possession of a Weapon 3rd degree, both felonies, and Menacing 3rd degree, a misdemeanor. He was arraigned at North Greenbush Town Court and released to return to that court at a later date. *Investigation by Officers Jukes, Lionarons, and Detective Walsh. Arrest by Sergeant Bourdeau*
