Officers had to remove her from the vehicle by force which resulted in one officer suffering a leg injury as she actively resisted their efforts. She initially refused to provide her name or any other personal information but officers identified her from previous incidents. She was found to have several active warrants, including two for failing to appear in North Greenbush Town Court on charges from a November 22, 2022 arrest for stealing \$240.72 in merchandise from Hannaford. She was charged with Assault 2nd degree, a felony, Petit Larceny, Obstructing Governmental Administration 2nd degree, Resisting Arrest, and Bail Jumping 3rd degree, all misdemeanors. She was arraigned at North Greenbush Town Court and remanded to Rensselaer County Jail on \$10,000 bail. She is to appear back in that court at a later date. *Officers Catlin and Fleming*

8:20 PM- **Arrest**- Steven Pickett, of Albany, was taken into custody during a traffic stop on Bloomingrove Dr. at North Greenbush Rd. when it was discovered that his license was revoked. He was charged with Aggravated Unlicensed Operation 3rd degree, a misdemeanor, Unlicensed Operation, and Failing to Stop at a Stop Sign, all infractions. He was released to return to court at later date. *Officers Valenti and Fleming*
