5:34 PM- **Arrest-** Jennifer Sacci, of Nassau, was taken into custody at Market 32 during a call for an unwanted guest. Staff reported that a female was believed to be doing drugs in the bathroom. Officers arrived to find the female described walking in an aisle in the store. During their interview, she was found to be in possession of cocaine and stolen merchandise from TJ Maxx. When officers attempted to handcuff her, she resisted by pulling away but was subdued without any injury. She then claimed a medical emergency and NGAA was called to respond. She was taken to the hospital for physical and mental health treatment. She was charged with Petit Larceny, Criminal Possession of a Controlled Substance 7th degree, Resisting Arrest, all misdemeanors, and Appearing in Public Under the Influence of Drugs, a violation. She is to appear in court at a later date. *Officers Valenti, Gray, Clemenzi, Cox, and Sergeant Bourdeau*

11:08 PM- **Welfare Check-** In the 100 block of Sharpe Rd. Caller reported a series of events that could not plausibly have occurred. Officers were familiar with the caller from past dealings and recognized that there was a medical issue involved which could cause delusions. Officers met with the caller and confirmed that there was no physical evidence to support the claims. Officers spoke with the caller to determine if there was a need for medical intervention but they were found not to be in crisis. *Officers Giddings and Verardi*
