1:14 AM- **Arrest**- Michael Bryan, of Poestenkill, was taken into custody during a traffic stop on State Route 150 and charged him with Driving While Ability Impaired by Drugs. Officer stopped him for erratic driving and, upon interview, observed indicators that he may have been impaired by drugs. Bryan was found to be operating with multiple suspensions and revocations on his license. He refused to submit to any chemical testing which may result in another revocation on his license. He was charged with Aggravated Unlicensed Operation 1st degree, a felony, Driving While Ability Impaired by Drugs 1st offense, a misdemeanor, and several traffic infractions. He was arraigned at North Greenbush Town Court and remanded to RCJ without bail as a predicate felon. He is to return to that court at a later date. *Officers Clemenzi, Pollay, and Sergeant Peasley*

12:13 PM- **Arrest**- April Foshee, of Ballston Spa, was taken into custody by Saratoga County Sheriff's Office and turned over to this agency on an outstanding arrest warrant. The warrant stemmed from a fraud investigation launched on March 5th, 2025. The victim reported that someone had accessed their bank account online and withdrew \$4,378. More attempts were made that totaled over \$1,000 but those were unsuccessful. It was believed that the same subject had opened a credit card account in the victim's name, also. During the investigation Foshee had provided a statement that was determined to not be truthful. Foshee was charged with Identity

Theft 1st degree, Computer Trespass, both felonies, False Statement, and Unlawful Possession of Personal Identifying Information, both misdemeanors. She was arraigned at North Greenbush Town Court and released to return to that court at a later date. *Investigation by Detective Fleming. Arrest by Officer Catlin*

6:25 PM- **Larceny**- In the 1700 block of Washington Ave Ext. Caller reported that someone had stolen a package from their front door. *Officer Verardi*

Field sobriety was attempted but Jacobs was unable to complete them due to being very unsteady on his feet. Once at the station, he refused any chemical testing which may result in his license being revoked. He was charged with Driving While Ability Impaired by Drugs 1st offense, a misdemeanor, Refusal to take breath test, and Moved from Lane Unsafely, both infractions. He was arraigned at North Greenbush Town Court and released to return to that court at a later date.
