On March 19th, it was reported that the 1-year-old animal was found deceased in the residence and that the circumstances didn't make sense. Mohawk Hudson Humane Society sent the remains for a necropsy and it was found that the dog had been beaten to death. The male was charged with Aggravated Cruelty to Animals, a felony, and arraigned at Rensselaer County Family Court. He was remanded to a secure facility pending a hearing at Rensselaer County Family Court at a later date. *Investigation and arrest by Detective Walsh*
